## Good Search

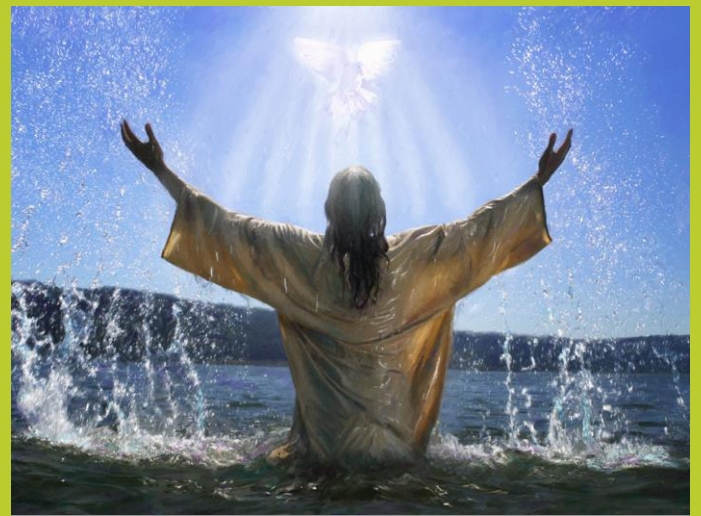

## AIGA Whistleblower Policy

AIGA's Standards of Conduct and Code of Ethics policy requires directors, officers and all AIGA representatives to observe high standards of professional and personal ethics in the conduct of their duties and responsibilities. As representatives of AIGA, we must practice honesty and integrity in fulfilling our responsibilities and comply with all applicable laws and regulations.

The purpose of this policy is to nurture a culture of honesty and integrity and ensure compliance with the Sarbanes-Oxley law by encouraging all AIGA representatives and students to report suspected or actual occurrences of illegal, unethical or inappropriate events, behaviors or practices; without fear of retaliation or retribution.

### Reporting Responsibility

It is the responsibility of all AIGA representatives and students to comply with the Code and to report violations or suspected violations in accordance with the Whistleblower Policy.

### No Retaliation

An AIGA representative or student, who in good faith reports a violation, shall not suffer harassment, retaliation or adverse consequences as a result. An AIGA representative who retaliates against someone who has reported a violation in good faith is subject to discipline. Whistleblower Policy is up to and including removal/termination from their position. This intended to encourage and enable AIGA representatives and students to raise serious concerns and arrive at resolution internally, prior to seeking resolution outside the Organization.

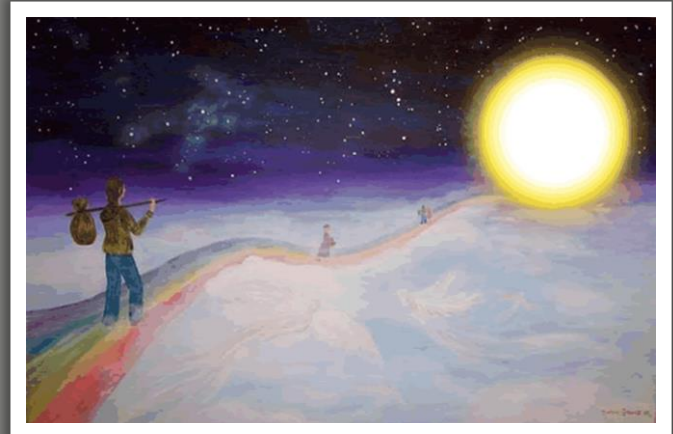
### Reporting Violations

AIGA has an open door policy and suggests that representatives and students share their questions, concerns, suggestions or complaints with someone who can address them properly. In most cases, a student's first point directing their local study center or the Delegate of their region. Instructors and Delegates are then required to immediately inform the Board of Directors of the complaint or suspected violation. Once the Board receives this information the President must be informed immediately. Within 5 working days of a concern being received, the President will write to the complainant to acknowledge that their concern has been received and an investigation into the matter will take place. The President must investigate the matter promptly and upon conclusion, if appropriate, will send a letter to the complainant informing them that the matter has been resolved.

Students or AIGA representatives are free to contact the Board of Directors directly with any concerns or to report a violation.

### Acting in Good Faith

Anyone filing a complaint concerning a violation or suspected violation of the Code must be acting in good faith and have reasonable grounds for believing the information disclosed indicates a violation of the Code. Any allegations that prove not to be substantiated and which prove to have been made maliciously or knowingly to be false will be viewed as a serious disciplinary offense.



## AIGA's Tax Returns

AIGA has grown up to close to 30 Institutions in the US and we are very happy about that. We have earned our legal privileged Non-Profit Status in an honest way but need to prove to the IRS and to all government agencies we are and continued to be a legitimate, well organized, credible Institution and at all times in good standing.

This means that every year we have to present clear timely tax reports and all Institutions need to contribute with clear, reliable reporting.

Yearly tax report cost AIGA approximately \$1,600 which National Headquarters has paid but needs to start collection from all Institutions \$100.00 donation to help pay this periodic reports as well as other expenses, if we all contribute it means that the monthly contribution per center is \$8.00 per month. We encourage all Institutes to open a box to deposit this amount on a timely basis to help National Headquarters expenses.
